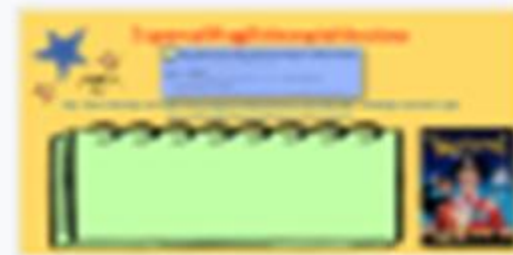

I plan to figure out other ways to incorporate the files into my classes for enrichment and keyboarding practice. Thanks for compiling all of these, Denise!

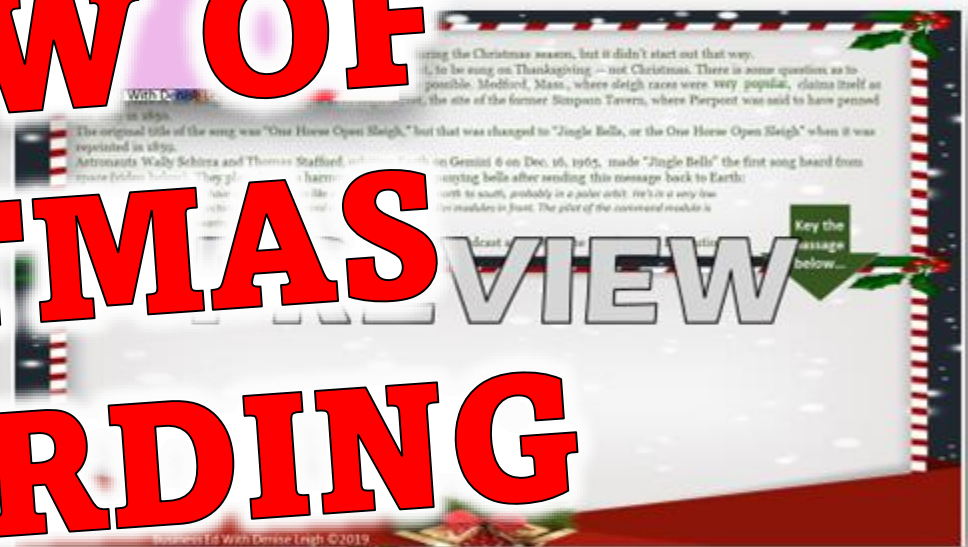
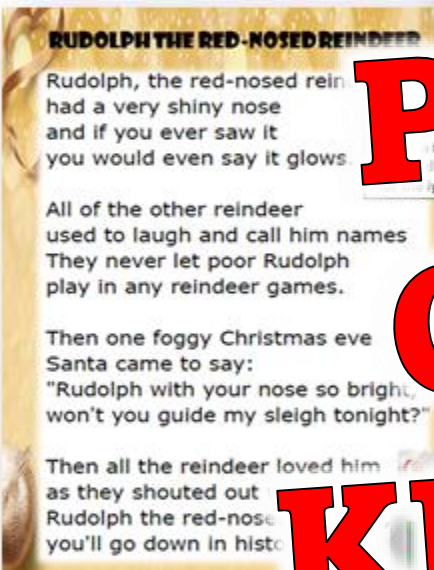

# Black Friday & Cyber Monday Keyboarding Practice File

**Black Friday**

The day after Thanksgiving was called "Black Friday" (by Philadelphia Police Officers) because of the traffic issues and shopping brawls that took place.

By 1961, "Black Friday" had caught on in Philadelphia, to the extent that the city's merchants and businesses had to change it to "Big Friday" in order to remove the negative connotation. The term didn't catch on until much later, and as recently as 1985 it wasn't common nationwide. Sometime in the late 1980s, however, retailers found a way to reinvent Black Friday, turning it into something that reflected positively rather than negatively, on them and their customers. The result was the "red to black" concept of the holiday, and the notion that the day after Thanksgiving marked the point when America's stores finally turned a profit. Stores traditionally see bigger sales on Saturday before Christmas.

The Black Friday story stuck, and pretty soon the term's darker roots in Philadelphia were forgotten. The one-day sales bonanza has become another "retail holiday" such as Cyber Monday. Stores started opening earlier, and most dedicated shoppers can't wait to get their hands on the deals. According to a pre-holiday survey conducted this year by the National Retail Federation, an estimated 135.8 million Americans definitely plan to shop over the Thanksgiving weekend (58.7 percent of those surveyed), though 79.6 percent said they also plan to shop on Cyber Monday.

In Ecuador, families dress a straw man in old clothes on December 31. The straw man represents the old year. The family members make a will for the straw man that lists all of their faults. At midnight, they burn the straw man, in hopes that their faults will disappear with him.

In Japan, Omisoka (or New Year's Eve) is the second most important holiday of the year, following New Year's Day, the start of a new beginning. Japanese families gather for a late dinner around 11 PM, and at midnight, many make visits to a shrine or temple. In many homes, there is a cast bell that is struck 108 times, symbolizing desires believed to cause human suffering.

## NEW YEAR

To celebrate the Chinese New Year, many children dress in new clothes to celebrate and people carry lanterns and join in a huge parade led by a silk dragon, the Chinese symbol of strength. According to legend, the dragon hibernates most of the year, so people throw firecrackers to keep the dragon awake.

Those in Hong Kong pray to the gods and ghosts of their ancestors, asking that they will fulfill wishes for the next year. Priests read aloud the names of every living person at the celebration and attach a list of the names to a paper horse and set it on fire. The smoke carries the names up to the gods and the living will be remembered.

## Winter Solstice

The Winter Solstice occurs around December 21. It is the shortest day of the year. People all over the world participate in festivities and celebrate.

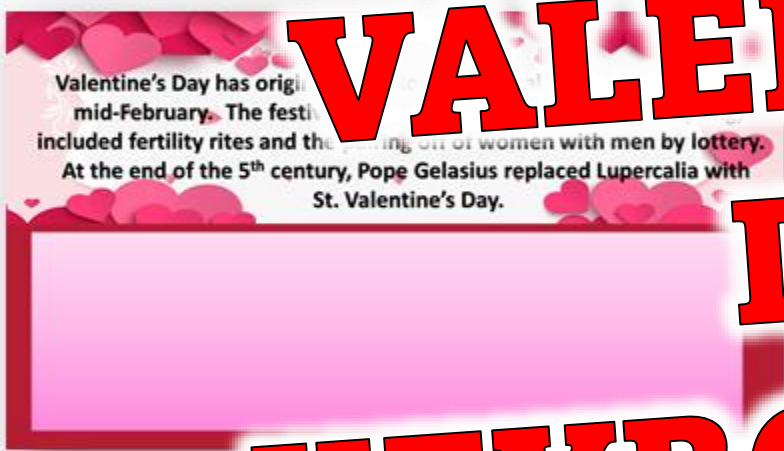

- King was the youngest person to be awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964.
- Martin Luther King, Jr. Day is a national holiday.
- At the Atlanta premier of the movie *Gone with the Wind*, Martin sang with his church choir.
- There are over 730 streets in the United States named after Martin Luther King, Jr.
- He was awarded the Congressional Gold Medal and the Presidential Medal of Freedom.
- The name on his original birth certificate is Michael King. This was a mistake, however, he was supposed to be named after his father who was named for Martin Luther, the leader of the Christian reformation movement.
- He is often referred to by his initials MLK.

Martin Luther King, Jr. was a Baptist minister and social activist who led the civil right movement in the United States from the mid 1950s until his death by assassination in 1968. His leadership was fundamental to that movement's success in ending the legal segregation of African Americans in the South and other parts of the United States. King rose to national prominence as head of the Southern Christian Leadership Conference, which promoted nonviolent tactics, such as the massive March on Washington (1963), to achieve civil rights. During this march, King delivered the famous "I have a dream" speech. He was awarded the
