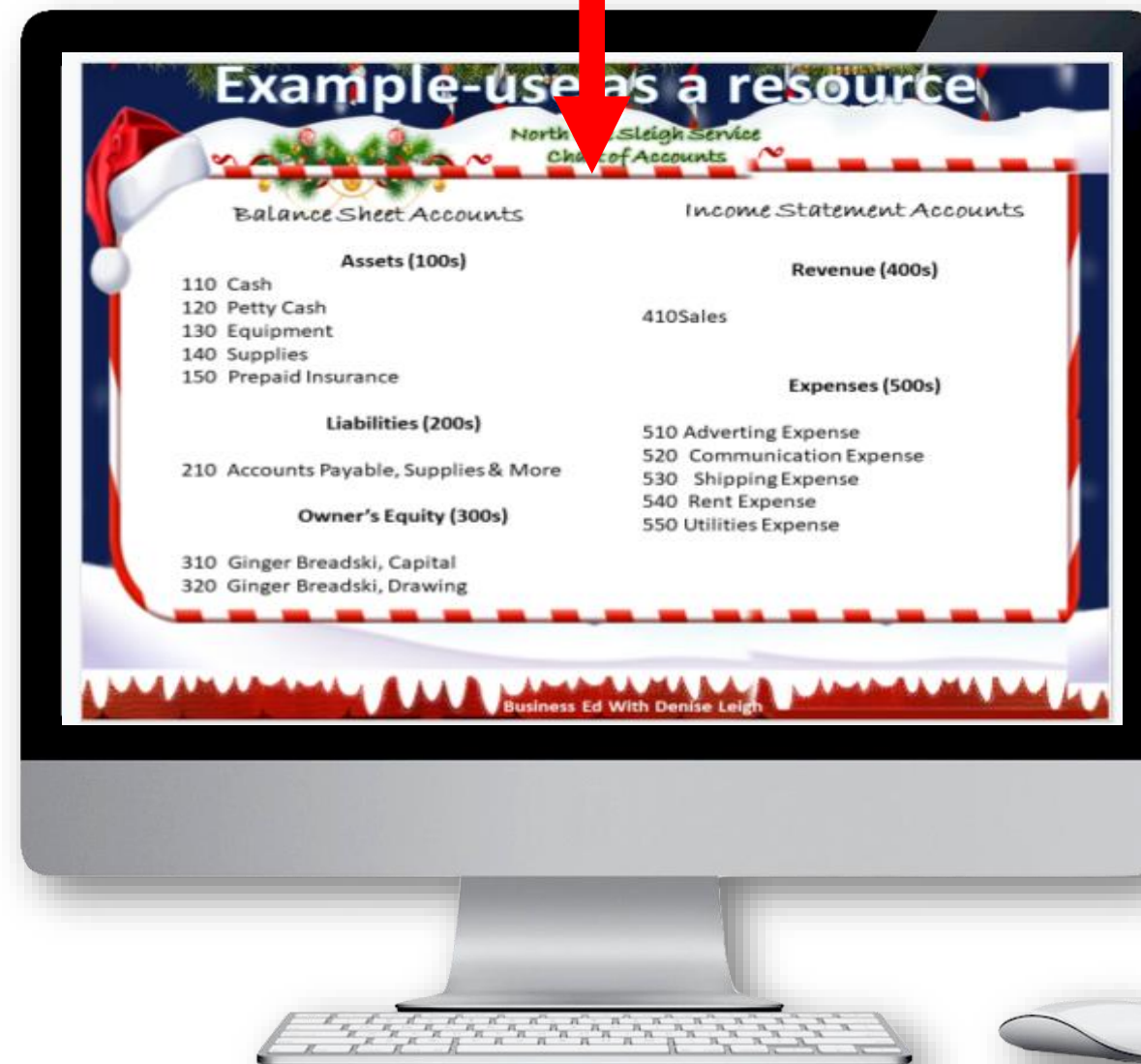

Students create a Chart of Accounts!



Students classify Santa's accounts as: Assets, Liabilities, or Owner's Equity using drag and drop circles.



Circle the ASSET accounts in GREEN
Circle the LIABILITY accounts in RED
Circle the OWNER'S EQUITY accounts in YELLOW
SLIDE THE CIRCLE (to the left) OVER TO CIRCLE THE ACCOUNTS.
