# 20 WRITING PROMPTS

### Product Promotion

Companies have several choices in which to advertise their products or services. Newspaper, TV commercials, radio, magazines, billboards, transit ads, and several social media outlets—just to name a few.

If YOU were the target market for a product that was just being released, what would be the best way to reach you? What is the best advertising vehicle to sell to you? Explain your answer?

### Paying Employees

Some companies pay their executive team (managers and bosses) very well with large quarterly or yearly bonuses based on sales and performance of the company. They do this with the philosophy that when you pay the "decision makers" well, based on sales performance, they will perform better. Other companies believe that paying entry-level workers (the ones who come in direct contact with the customer) very well, it will directly affect the company performance and customer experience and sales will increase as a result.

What direction would you take if given a payroll budget that would not allow bonuses and pay increases across the board? Would you pay the executive team better with large bonuses? OR Would you pay your entry-level workers a better wage? Explain your thought process...

### No Accounting?

Accounting (as a financial system) exists for many reasons. With a good accounting system in place, a business can determine whether they have a net loss or net income, if they have enough money to fulfill their obligations, keep track of money coming in and going out, and keep track of assets, liabilities, and owner's equity—just to name a few.

### Business Ownership

It takes a lot of talent and discipline to be a sole proprietor of a business. To some, it is their dream to do so. Others may wish to share the responsibility and financial obligations with a business partner or partners. Individuals who have no desire to own and operate a business, but still want to be part of business ownership, may want to invest in a business through the stock market or become a shareholder.

What would be your preference? Would you want to own your own business? Partner with someone? Or Invest? Explain your response.

### GMO? Organic?

Farmers feed families! It is a known fact that we rely on farmers for our food supply. Large food companies will use GMOs, Genetically Modified Organisms, to improve quality of food and to increase yield produced to make their crops more productive. These companies claim that GMOs are safe and there is little scientific evidence to prove otherwise. Some farmers and companies advertise their products as organic, meaning that they use no GMOs when producing, growing, and harvesting their crops. Organic foods are more expensive as the farmers and companies practicing organic farming typically harvest less food due to pests, and other factors that can interfere with crop production.

If you were running a food company, what would your production practices reflect? Would you use GMOs to increase profitability? Would you sell organic knowing that you may not be making as much as you could otherwise?

### Why lose money?

When ordering on Amazon, a customer may be surprised to get the package the next day, and in some cases the SAME DAY! Amazon often loses money on this fast delivery policy.

What is the benefit of delivering such fast service to Amazon customers? Explain...

### Is Amazon and Facebook listening?

Amazon and Facebook have gotten so good at tracking us, our spending, our interests, and our desires, that many think that our phones listen to us! Google said it can access "70 percent of credit and debit card transactions in the United States." Along with Facebook and others, it also monitors much of what we are doing across the web. Using hidden tracking technologies, the companies can see many of the pages you and people connected to you, are visiting, allowing them to better tailor their ads.

What are your feelings on being "watched" as a consumer? Are you grateful for ads that come up on your feed for items that interest you...or are you creeped out? Explain...

### Trademark Infringement

Starbucks brand is one of the most copied brand. They are always taking action to protect another brand from infringing on their trademark.

Why do you think that is?

### Anti-trust Laws

Anti-trust laws are put into place to protect consumers from monopolies. These laws operate on the premise that competition is necessary to make the playing field fair with pricing and quality of products and services. Yet there are still companies that tend to monopolize an industry.

Can you think of a product or service that has no competition? Do you think that there should be protection for consumers against any type of monopoly?

So many companies would not exist today without cell phones. Uber and Lyft are examples of companies that would not exist without the evolution of cell phone use.

Give examples of another company that would not exist without cell phones. Explain how that company makes your life easier and/or more enjoyable.

### No Brick and Mortar Stores

With the efficiency and convenience of online, retail sites like Amazon and Walmart have become so successful and popular, some economists believe that someday, there will be no malls. They say that the "brick and mortar" stores will be no longer. With Amazon's recent purchase of Whole Foods, we may be even a step closer to that theory becoming a reality.

What problems may arise if the only way to get products is through the web? What are your feelings on the possibility that this may be our future retail reality?

### Dairy Farmer Dilemma

The #1 grocery store item is milk. Some individuals eliminate dairy products from their diet due to various reasons. Almond producers started making a product called "almond milk" as a dietary alternative and some say healthier choice to cow milk. Dairy farmers and dairy marketing companies went after the almond industry with a "cease and desist" demanding that they not call their product "milk". They were successful for the time being...but the battle goes on.

Should the almond industry be able to call their product almond milk? Why or why not?

### Contract Law

Minors, individuals under the age of 18, cannot legally enter into a contract. They can't buy a car (even if they have the cash to purchase it) on their own.
